2017 SWIMMING CARNIVAL

Due to an unforeseen clash of dates next year, our swimming carnival has had to be brought forward a week and will now be held on Tuesday, 31st January – the 2nd day back! This means ALL entry forms and permission notes must be back this year!

Next week, an information note will be sent home with all students currently in Years 2 to 5 and Year 1 students who turn 8 in 2017 and who indicate they compete at swim club or nippers and can swim 50m competently.

All entry forms, permission notes and payments must be returned by Wednesday, 14th December. Only new enrolments in 2017 will be accepted in 2017. All students in Years 3 to 6 (2017) are expected to attend as there will be no supervision at school for students in these grades on Tuesday, 31st January.

BEEP TESTING

Mrs Heaton recently tested all students from years K to 5 on the Beep test which involves students running 20 metres with a rest in between that becomes increasingly shorter. She will conduct this test next year to determine if there has been an improvement in the general fitness of our students. We had some excellent results such as one Kindergarten girl who achieved a score a 12 year old would be pleased with. There were also some worrying results with some Year 5 students recording scores equal with Kindergarten. If we want our students to live life to the fullest, being physically fit is one way to achieve this. Take your kids out for a walk or a run. Join a sporting team. Go for a bike ride or a swim. Parents can lead by example and show age does not mean we don't maintain a good level of fitness.

REPORTS


All reports will be issued to students on Monday, 12th December

- 1. A "satisfactory" result in any subject shows the student has achieved all of the skills, values and knowledge planned in the teaching program. "Satisfactory" means the student has understood the concepts and has demonstrated achievement of the learning goals. Most students at our school fall into this category. If your child receives this grade, he/she is on track with a sound performance.
- 2. If a student receives a "well-developed" ranking he/she is performing very well with the work presented and has consistently met the outcomes at a high level for

the reporting period. This has been evident across assessment tasks. The student demonstrates the confidence, skills and understandings which are going to enable them to easily extend their learning in the area.

- 3. If a student receives an "outstanding" ranking, he/she is performing far above the expected standard and is regularly applying skills, extensive knowledge and deep understanding to new situations.
- 4. The topic of effort is different in that we feel all students are capable of producing a sustained effort no matter their ability level. If your child receives a 4 or 5 ranking for their effort in each subject he or she is to be congratulated for their commitment.

Blue report folders should be returned to school to enable your child's report to reach home in a good condition. Children who have enrolled since the beginning of Term 3 will be issued with a new folder.
