

Our K-2 Hastings Hero award is proudly presented to Maddox Styles (2M) following an email the school received from his very proud mum! The citation reads ...

In October, while driving back to Port Macquarie along the North Shore beach, we came across a truck that was bogged scarily close to the water and the tide rising. The driver had actually given up trying to get his truck out and in desperation had started to dig a wall around the truck to help stop the water from coming in. In the vehicle was a toddler and a dog. My husband pulled up on the high side and started to strap the bogged truck to his in an attempt to free them. Without hesitation, my son Maddox, jumped out of our truck and yelled 'I'll get the tyre pressure down Dad!' Maddox then grabbed a stick and used it to let the trapped truck's tyre pressure down. He never took a second to think about the water splashing up on him, or how scary this situation really was. He just helped however he could. After about 20 minutes we towed the truck free! The driver was so grateful and we were so proud

of our brave boy. It wasn't until we were all on dry land that Maddox fully realised how serious the situation was. The driver stopped his truck and literally started emptying water out of the sides of his truck! So close. Congratulations, Maddox! At the age of 8 your bravery and calmness under pressure made you a true beach rescue hero that day!


ON MONDAY 30th JANUARY
