## MAINTENANCE WORK

At the end of this month the next stage of the Department's integration works will commence in Courtyard 1. # NSW PREMIER'S SPORTING CHALLENGE



Our school has registered again to participate for the third year in the **2016 NSW Premier's Primary School Sport Challenge**.

The purpose of the Challenge is to encourage students to participate in sport, games and physical activity and to have *more students, more active, more often!*

Over a ten week period commencing Monday 30<sup>th</sup> May, our school will be monitoring the physical activity we do during class time, at recess and lunch as well as during sport. What we do outside school hours will also count towards the Challenge award for our school.

It's not hard! Any daily physical activity of moderate to vigorous intensity can be used to accrue time. Moderate activities could be as simple as brisk walking, bike riding with friends, skateboarding, lawn bowls, playground games, yoga and dancing. Vigorous activities are associated with such activities as Australian Football, netball, aerobics, soccer, running, fitness circuits, dance, hockey, martial arts, cross country running, kilometre club, swimming laps and training for sport.

Each student has been issued with a Challenge log book to record their physical activity and will be recorded weekly on the PSC website by their teacher.

The challenge will conclude in Term 3 where all data will be collected, collated and sent back to the Premier's Sporting Challenge. Many of our staff are also competing in the Staff Challenge. All students who participate will also receive a certificate at the end of the year. Can you beat your previous year's achievement?

We look forward to our school continuing to get fitter and healthier through this fun experience.

## CYBER SAFETY

With Cyber Safety talks being held for Year 5 & Year 6 next Thursday it is a good time to share with our families the following information which was forwarded to school by a parent ...

*"Sites such as Kik, Instagram, Snapchat are not secure and mostly require users to be 13."*

I have recently learnt that a number of online presentation websites, including Prezi, also fall into this category. Two excerpts from Prezi's terms and conditions at <https://prezi.com/terms-of-use/> are:

*"Prezi Public (free) Accounts. If you have a Prezi Public (free) account, all of the content you create, including all of the information within your presentations, and your user name will be available to anyone who has access to the internet ("Public User Content"). Public presentations can be viewed by other Prezi users, will appear in the searchable Prezi database, and will be available for others to access and view online. Accordingly, you hereby do and shall grant to each User and to the public a worldwide, non-exclusive, revocable license to access, view and publicly perform your Public User Content. This license ends when you delete the presentation or your account is closed (either by you or by us), except to the extent that the content has been shared with others and they have not deleted it." "Users must be at least 13 years old. Users must be 13 years of age or older to use the Service. By using the Service you represent that you are 13 or older, and that you will not permit a minor under the age of 13 to use the Service, your Prezi account, or otherwise interact with the Service. Prezi will never knowingly solicit or accept personally identifiable information or other content from a user or visitor who Prezi knows is under 13 years of age. If Prezi discovers that a user under 13 years of age has created an account, or that a user or visitor under 13 years of age has posted personally identifiable information or other content to the Service, Prezi will terminate the account and remove the information or other content."*

As a test, I did a Google search on the names of some students at Hastings Public School along with the word Prezi, and I was able to easily find a number of school projects available for anybody to see. This is particularly concerning with projects such as 'All About Me' which my child is currently working on. Other websites such as <https://www.emaze.com/> and <http://www.visme.co/> and <http://slides.com/> also make presentations publicly available unless you get a paid subscription. It may be worth alerting staff, students and parents to these points. On the positive side, [popplet.com](http://popplet.com) is a website that makes projects private by default. The terms and conditions do talk about users being at least 13 years old. I emailed [support@popplet.com](mailto:support@popplet.com) and received the following response:

*Thanks for your interest in Popplet! Popplet's policy for children under 13 requests that the educator or parent in charge create the Popplet account and oversee its use by the child, which is in compliance with COPPA. Since Popplet does not collect any private information about the user beyond the basic login information (unlike Facebook or Gmail), this use is in compliance with COPPA.*

*If you have any other questions about using Popplet with students, please let me know.*
