Bike Safety

We have seen a large increase lately in the number of children riding bikes to school. While it is great to see children being active and independent, this has also prompted us to review our schools Bike Safety Policy. We will have our revised policy ready to implement at the beginning of 2021, in the meantime here are a few reminders of the recommendations made by the Department of Education in regards to primary school children riding bikes to school.

- Children under 10 years of age should not ride bicycles to and from school unless accompanied by an adult.
- Riders must follow all road rules including:
 - Ride to the left of footpaths
 - Give pedestrians right of way on footpaths
 - Watch for cars entering or leaving driveways
- Children must correctly wear a Standards Australia approved bicycle helmet at all times when in control of a bicycle.
- Bicycles ridden to school must be in good, safe working order and bicycles must be fitted with a bell.
- Parents are responsible for their children's safety when they are travelling to and from school.
